Riddell said household work-ers in particular often work for a number of employers, either on a regular schedule of one or more days a week, or on an irregular basis.

or on an irregular basis. In addition to reporting in-come from all such employ-ment, household workers should be sure that any em-ployer paying them \$50 or more in any calendar quarter reports the wages and pays both the employer and em-ploye portion of the sicial se-provide monthly Social Secur-nue Service. These payments provide monthly Social Secur-ity payments and other bene-fits to workers qualifying.

COVERED ARE persons working as maids, laundresses, cooks, housekeepers, garden-ers, janitors, furnacemen, gov-ernesses, valets, chauffeurs, etc.

Director Riddell reminded birector Riddell reminded household employers that these taxes must be reported on Form 942 which is required to be filed by the end of the month following the calendar quarter. That is, by April 30, July 31, Oct. 31, and Jan. 31, as required Failure to do so as required. Failure to do so results in an accumulated tax liability and can lead to inter-est and penalty charges, he warned.

Riddell said Forms 942 can be obtained from any Internal Revenue office and that his staff would be happy to answer any questions with respect to application of this tax. The re-quirements also are set forth in detailed, easy to understand language in Internal Revenue Circular H. "Household Em-ployer's Social Security Tax Guide," which is available on request. Riddell said Forms 942 can request.
