Not only are the waxy pink blooms appealing to look at, but their fragrance is come-thing out of this world. A dish full of daphne blooms will fill your house with wonderful per-fume. THERE ARE several daphne THERE ARE several dapnine varities available for the gar-den, but the one you will want for an early spring is the wide-ly grown Winter Daphne, so named here in California be-cause of its bloom season. Ac-tually it is a spring flower in most parts of the country. The India Hawthorns are

The India Hawthorns are also as early as January in California gardens, producing lovely pink heads of bloom that are delicately scented if you get up close and sniff. And now C.A.N. nurserymen offer refined new versions of this shrub including the superb "Springtime" and "Enchan-tress," recommended heartily for sun or part sun, in any soil and with any degree of care.

THERE ARE many shrubs in the osmanthus family, but one that gives the most bloom is the Delavay Osmanthus. In late winter it is covered with small white flowers not as fragrant as its cousin, the Sweet Olive, but far showier. This is an excellent shrub for tubbing on a sunny south terrace or deck, and one which gives you spring-like bloom as early as anything available at the nurs-

ery. Camellias are an obvious choice for bringing spring early, and while they start blooming in the fall, the bulk of them are just now reaching their peaks. The varities are on numerous as to defy listing. we suggest you simply stop in at a nursery and choose the ones you like. Or better, per-haps, choose as many as you can afford. You'll like all of them


