ing on Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's proposal to merge the 25 Judicial Districts into nine.

Hahn reactivated the "Nine Court Plan" before the Board of Supervisors March 12 and instructed the Chief Adminis-trative Officer to report on his consultations with the judges within a month.

"The Chief Justice of the State Supreme Court, the Hon.
Phil S. Gibson, has repeatedly
endorsed the general principle
of unification of the municipal courts of Los Angeles County," Hahn said.

HF. POINTED OUT that in 1960 the Municipal Court Judges Assn. submitted to the Board of Supervisors the "Nine Court Plan."

The Judges association stated the proposed consolidation would "equalize the work load of the judges, expedite the handling of judicial business, and generally improve (and we hope economize) the administration of justice in Los Angeles County," Hahn said.

HAHN NOTED unification requires concurrent state legis-lative action, and geographical merginb of the district by the

pervisors.
"Unification is consistent

"Unification is consistent with past and present conclusions reached by experts studying the Municipal Court setup in this county," Hahn said.

The California Joint Judicial Committee on the Administration of Justice issued a report in 1959 stating there was an "excessive number of judicial districts in Los Angeles County" and that "efficiency of the Courts would be increased by having fewer and larger districts."
