Camp Fire Girls Help Community

Learning how to set a table correctly and attractively for guests . . . Or make up an original recipe and have it tested and approved by a home economist . . .

These are skills a young girl can point to with pride. They are the foundation for tomorrow's ideal homemaker.

Girls from 7 to 18 are taught these skills, and many others centered around homemaking, while they become Camp Fire Girls.

THE CAMP Fire Girls, founded in 1910, is organized to serve local communities through its educational-recreational program for girls.

Some 1600 girls and women are presently participating in the Harbor District Camp Fire Girls which includes San Pedro, Wilmington, Torrance, Gardena and the Peninsula area, with offices in the Centinela Valley.

Nearly half the support of the organization is provided through funds from the Los Angeles Community Chest.

RECENTLY, a new program, dividing the girls into four age groups instead of three, was originated. Now there's a Junior Hi category for girls 10 to 13 which is geared to their special needs.

The other groups are the Blue Birds for girls 7 and 8; Camp Fire Girls, 9, 10, and 11; and the Horizon Club for 14 to 17.

The Chest-supported Camp Fire Girls enjoy summer camping at Camp Yalani (Indian word for mountain) in the San Bernardino Mountains and hold day camps at Crestwood Park and Kenter Canyon.

AT THEIR weekly meetings, the girls work for honors in the seven crafts—home, creative arts, outdoors, frontiers of science, building, sports and games and citizenship.

"The feminine role of homemaker, which is apt to be neglected these days, is emphasized in our groups," says Cynthia Keyes, district director.

"Mothers, and fathers too, appreciate the training even our youngest girls get in everyday tasks of homemaking," she said.

Miss Keyes also noted that a girl's potentialities are developed through the program recalling the example of a shy little Blue Bird who blossomed into a leader of the senior girls to represent the council at the national jubilee.

has disclosed that almost 15,000 traffic accident fatalities could be avoided annually in the United States if each state maintained a vigorous program of motor vehicle safety inspection.

"I FEEL strongly that a requirement to have motor vehicles of 10 years of age or over periodically inspected for adequate brakes, lights and general mechanical condition, would do much to reduce their threat on our highways," Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said.

In a letter to Governor Brown, Hahn stressed "We must continue to impress upon the state legislature the need for a positive program of highway safety."

THE SUPERVISOR cited a plan in Pennsylvania in which all vehicles are inspected twice annually at authorized garages. The inspection is tied in with regular maintenance service so the automobile owner receives it as a matter of course.
