of the California Vehicle Code of the California Venicie Code set down the regulation for these pedestrian control de-vice. As a pedestrian, each person has traffic responsibil-ities when he fails to observe traffic laws, and can be cited for these violations.

No pedestrian shall start to cross the roadway in the direction of of such signal, but any pedestrian who has partially completed his crossing on the "walk" signal shall proceed to a sidewalk, safety zone or island while the "wait" or "don't walk" signal is showing.

LAST YEAR, three of the five traffic fatalities in Torrance involved pedestrians. As part of the walking public, each pedestrian is asked to do his part by obeying the city's traffic laws and helping to keep the city accident-free.
