and as soon as France tested he could break the agreement through the "escape clause," while retaining the propaganda.
But the immediate political rewards to be accrued by President Kennedy and Prime Minister Macmillan are immense. Even if the treaty is only temporary, the favorable political effects could not have been ignored from their treaty assessments.
Since Yalta and Potsdam

we have dangerously allowed the initiative to remain in Soviet hands. Khrushchev practically made us crawl to Moscow for the agreement, and gained an important propaganda advantage.
He built up Red China to kill 36,000 of our manhood in Korea and forced us to spill more blood and spend more millions in Laos and Vietnam.
The test ban is another example that agreements in the cold war are mainly in Soviet hands.
Whether to blackmail his former soul-mate, Red China, or for other sinister reasons Khrushchev dramatically reversed himself on the test ban, in our opinion, not for

peace with the West or for the world, but probably because he believes this step was necessary to our "eventual burial."
In a world of surprising shifts and shocks, it is possible that the devastation of nuclear war may have sobered Khrushchev to the point where his plans for our burial temporarily at least, might have changed course from military to economic... for it is reported that he raised the question of removal of U.S. trade embargoes at the Moscow conference.
But to prove his good faith Khrushchev should now agree
