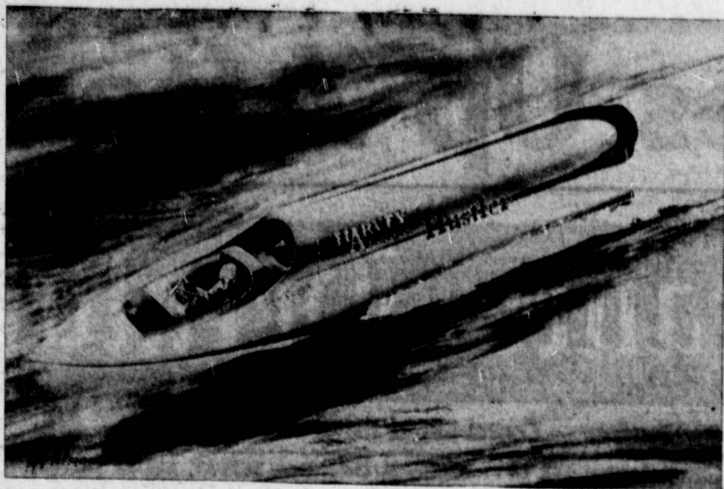
A veteran of World War I, Mr. Goetz had lived in the area for a number of years. He was a former employe of The HERALD.

FOR SPEED RECORD . . . Completion of the 29-foot jet-powered hydroplane boat is expected soon, report officials at Harvey Aluminum, sponsor of the new craft. Lee Taylor, a 28-year-old drag boat pilot, will attempt to topple the existing world water speed mark of 260.35 mph. The record assault is planned for late this year at an unannounced location. Engine tests were begun this week on the craft.

Hydroplane Craft Nears Completion

Engine testing of a new jet hydroplane was under way this week at the Harvey Aluminum plant in Torrance. The new hydroplane, to be known as the Hustler, is being built to take a crack at Donald Campbell's existing water mark of 260.35 miles per hour.

"The test schedule on the J-46 jet engine includes a systems check, throttle calibration, and panel control setting," explained Lee Taylor, driver and co-builder of the 29-foot craft. The boat is constructed around a turbojet unit. It was designed by Rich Hallett, a "hot boat" specialist. It is the first such boat to use an after-

burner to provide extra thrust. Taylor is readying the new craft for a try at the world water mark late this year. The boat is being sponsored by Harvey Aluminum. No place for the assault has been announced.

ASSEMBLYMAN Vincent Thomas sent a letter which was read to the board. Thomas said he wanted to go on record as favoring the location of the college in Torrance.

Spokesmen for the Torrance delegation said they felt the hearing was as fair and objective as one could get, and the Torrance position is felt to be good.

A final decision by the Board of Public Works is expected within six weeks. If the Peninsula site is not approved, the matter of site selection must be sent back to the Board of Trustees.

Hold Tax Rate Asks Chamber

Acting on the recommendation of the governmental affairs committee, the Board of Directors of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce has adopted a resolution calling on the city council to hold the tax rate for 1963-64 at its present level.

The Chamber anticipates the council will set the city tax rate on Aug. 27 at its regular meeting.

The governmental affairs committee made a study of the tax rates of Torrance and surrounding cities. The data was used to compare and analyze the present tax rates.

The Chamber of Commerce resolution asks that the rate be held at the current \$1.238 per \$100 of assessed valuation. The committee felt an increase would have a negative effect on inducing new business and industry to move to Torrance.
