# Garden Checklist

1: Dahlias should be watered regularly and deeply. Be sure to stake tall plants to keep them from toppling under the weight of their blooms

2. Well-fed fuchsias will continue blooming into fall. Use an acid-type food or fish fertilizer.

3. Many of your favorite perennials can be sown in flats this month. Check the seed rack at your local

4. Feed roses for continued bloom into fall. Blooms in November depend on good care now

5. Plant Sweet Peas before the end of the month if you want blooms by Christmas.
