It's about time, then, that others who rose up in arms to protect those poor little things from avaricious mothers, who want to line their purses at the expense of the child.

"Either keep it and keep your mouth shut," or have the baby put under State protection and given to some appreciative person.

Don't argue with me. Remember, you could have said "No," until you had a man who listened to your "Yes" in front of a minister.
