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Upjohn Co. To Acquire Local Firms

Upjohn Co., pharmaceutical manufacturers, will acquire the CPR International Corp. and TP Industries, Inc., of Torrance, according to an announcement by R. T. Parfet Jr., President of the Upjohn Co., and T. P. Dougan, president of the two Torrance firms.

The acquisition, which will be made in exchange for 85,000 shares of Upjohn stock, was approved last week by the pharmaceutical firm's board of directors.

CPR and TP firms make and sell polyurethane foams, precision molded urethane products, and provide related technical services.

The local management is expected to remain in charge of the firms, which will operate at CRP Division of the Upjohn Co.

Women's Club In Opposition To Test Ban

Opposition to the test ban treaty was expressed this week by the Torrance Republican Federated Women in a resolution that will be sent to the U.S. Senate.

The resolution states that the Soviet Socialist government "has by action and verbal admission made it known that treaties are merely instruments to further Soviet goals by making them binding and crippling to their opponents."

"The current test ban treaty would further the interests of the Soviet Socialists by restricting U.S. atmospheric tests," the resolution continues.

Concluding, the resolution says, "This treaty could render our country helpless to defend its shores, and thereby force our country into surrender to a one world socialist system."
