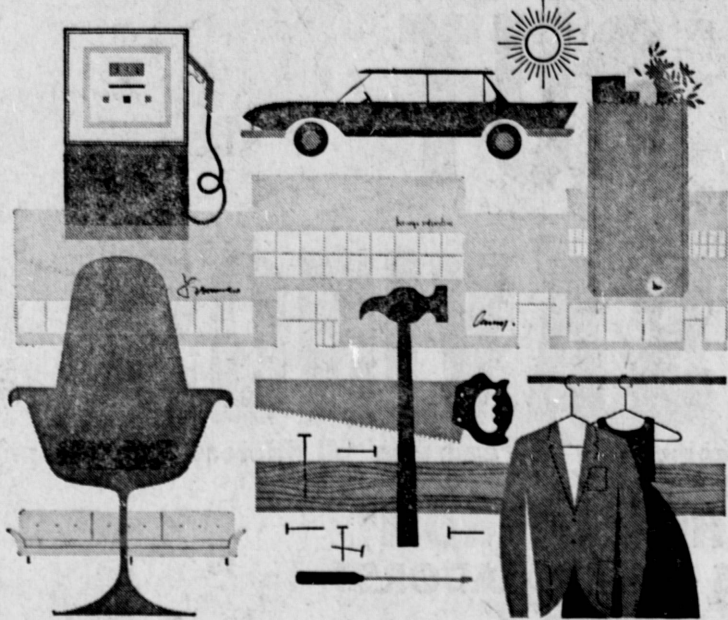

**City Offers Part-Time Noon Jobs**

College students, parents, and adults will have an opportunity to pick up part-time work through the Los Angeles City School District this fall. Los Angeles City elementary

schools will need noon-duty playground directors to supervise children in cafeterias, outside eating areas and on school playgrounds.

Successful applicants will be hired at the rate of \$2.16 per hour. Smaller schools are allowed three hours assistance per day and larger schools up to seven hours assistance. Applicants must be a high

school graduate, a U.S. citizen in good health with physical agility, and not more than 66 years old by July, 1964.

Elementary school principals will interview applicants today, tomorrow and Sept. 10, 11, 12 and 13 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
