CLASSES for boys and girls, 8 to 14 years old, will start on Sept. 14 from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. There will be a 75 cent registration fee and an additional charge for material.

A children's ceramics class will also begin next Saturday and will run from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. for youths 6 to 13. The \$1 fee covers the cost of all materials.

THE ADULT craft studio will begin tomorrow with lecture-demonstrations on ceramic techniques scheduled on Wednesday from 1 to 2:30 p.m. and Thursday from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Workshops will be held Wednesday from 2:30 to 4 p.m. and Thursday from 1 to 4 p.m. and 8 to 10 p.m.

Those who wish to work on mosaic or copper enameling projects will be welcome to the workshops. The enrollment fee in the four-week session of adult crafts studio is \$1 and entitles the individual to attend lecture-demonstrations and workshops.

ACCORDING to Arts and Crafts Center Director Erika Muhl, registrations for all classes will be accepted at the beginning of each session.

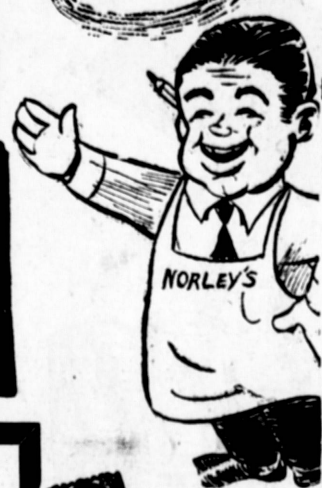
