

meeting. Mrs. Albert Nadel will serve as moderator. Dr. Morgner is head of the department of economics at the School of International Relations at the University of Southern California. He is a specialist on the Brazilian economy and has taught as a visiting professor at the Es-cola de Sociologia, Universi-dade de Sao Paulo, in Brazil.

HE HAS recently returned from trips in Latin America, and has spent the last two years studying the effects of the Alliance for Progress.
