KIRK, WITH Marvin Klotz, San Fernando State College English professor, has put into the book identities and interrelations of approximately 1,200 named characters from Faulkner's novels, short stories and sketches.

PART I of the book present Faulkner's novels in order of their publication and under each title the characters are named with concise characterizations and notations of pages upon which the character's name occurs.

This scheme is repeated in Part II for the characters in the short stories and sketches. Genealogical charts of the Sar-toris, Burden and McCaslin-Ed-monds-Beauchamp families, as well as a map of Yoknapatawpa County are provided.

Kirk spent five years writ-ing the book, which grew from his doctoral dissertation at the University of Southern Califor

"PERHAPS THE book was begun the day I was born in Amory, Mississippi, because Amory is only 17 miles from Faulkner's home in Oxford, Miss.," Kirk said.
