News Link Vital for Americans

 The Battle of New Orleans was won by Americans under Major General Andrew Jackson on Jan. 8, 1815, during the War of 1812. The Americans were vastly outnumbered by the British, who attacked with what they called "the flower of the British Army," troops which had defeated Napoleon Bonaparte, under their great Major General Pakenham, but American riflemen and artillerymen killed or seriously wounded about 2,000 of the 9,000 British soldiers. The American loss was only

71 men out of a total of about 4,000 soldiers, marines, pirates, and Negro slaves. Ironically, the battle of New Orleans, the final engagement of the War of 1812, had no bearing on the termination of the war because peace had been declared by the Treaty of Ghent, signed 15 days before the battle. The news of both the battle and the peace treaty reached Washington, D.C., the same week.

THE BATTLE of New Orleans is an excellent example of the importance of communications. It inspired the passage of a federal law in 1857 for good or bad, depending upon your own viewpoint. For example, the McClatchy newspapers, which are The Sacramento Bee, The Fresno Bee, and the Modesto Bee, have a few editorial policies which are determined by the owners. These policies are expressed primarily on the editorial page, although some of the important news stories reflect the same policies. If you read one of the three McClatchy newspapers carefully for a few weeks, you can determine for yourself which news items are "slanted." Then, if you use your own good judgment, you can accept or reject the "slanted" reports and read the remainder of the (Continued on Page 11)
