## •Tests Slated In November

Regular qualifying examinations for enlistments in the United States Navy will be given throughout November, reports Chief VanDorne Isaak, In charge of the Torrance Navy Recruiting Station.

Chief Isaak said the examinntions will be given from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. each weekday during the month. The procedure is being set up in support of the unrestricted quotas being assigned for November and December by the Navy.

High school graduates who qualify through the local testing may enlist on a guaranteed Naval technical contracts which will assure them of a school in the field of their choice before enlistment.

Schools are operated in such fields as electronics. Navy air force, hospital or dental, nuclear or polaris submarine duty, or general skills. Terms of enlistments may be three, four, or six years.

Men who do not want technical schools will be assigned to ships of the global fleet for onthe-job training after a nineweek recruit training period.
