New Horizons Opens to Zing Of Golf Swing

Putting tournaments were a highlight at grand opening ceremonies of New Horizons-South Bay, according to Ray Watt and Richard H. Meine, partners in the development.

The ceremonies and competition Friday marked the first day of a three-day opening event planned for New Horizons, adult recreation and garden home community in Torrance.

Located on an 80-acre site on Sepulveda between Crenshaw and Hawthorne boulevards, New Horizons-South Bay is an \$18 million Gold Medallion condominium community.

It includes 600 garden homes; a 10,000-square-foot clubhouse and recreation building; nine-hole three-par golf course, swimming pool, hobby facilities, and the 5672 sq. ft. putting green which is surrounded by a huge lake.

New Horizons - South Bay, according to Watt, embodies a new concept in land planning and development in which residential and recreational living is a "community within a community." The plan creates a park-like atmosphere through use of the golf course, pedestrian malls and greenbelts between garden homes.

The invitational press preview, at which civic officials and media personnel putted frop rizes, was to be followed Saturday and today by grand opening festivities for the public, Watt said.
