# ...Let's Go

Mexico is like a sleeping giant . . . huge and awkward, but suddenly beginning to awaken. My impressions of Mexico have always been lumped together . . . partly formed by the movies' stereotype of the Mexican peasant and partly from the social conditions of Mexican field workers that are part of our local scene.

Needless to say, the impression would have continued to be a mistaken one, had I not gone to Mexico last year. What I found was revealing in every respect. Not only is the countryside breathtaking, the people warm and friendly, the facilities for travelers modern and up-to-date. . . but the cost of seeing Mexico is as reasonable as any spot in the world.

THE TOURIST people in Mexico expect an increase of 30 per cent in visitors from abroad in the next 12 months. There is more to Mexico than the border towns that often leave a bad taste in the mouths of "one-day tourists" to a foreign land.

Am planning on organizing a Christmas tour to Mexico in 1964 so I'm making plans now to spend 10 days in Mexico City, Acapulco, and Cuernavaca this Christmas.

Will try to "dry-run" a good inexpensive 10-day tour to see the facilities, sightseeing, etc. Speaking the language helps in any country and particularly in Mexico. When I last went to Mexico, I tried not to speak one word of English, and it paid off . . . even though I had to refer to my Spanish dictionary a few times.

HAVE BEEN working on an 8-day Easter tour to Hawaii and soon I will have the plans set definitely, have been trying to hold it down to \$279 in order to be competitive, and it looks as though that will be the price. Hope to have 40 people . . . several already are planning on it.

Times are changing so rapidly and travel is being affected, just as much as anything else, if not more. Today, there is no such thing as a "general" traveler. Some people travel to forget, others travel to learn. Some find more beauty in a Danish hog than in the Mona Lisa. Some would rather ski in the Alps than be presented at the Court of St. James. To many the Colosseum is an architectural masterpiece . . . to others it is merely a mass of rubble.

MORE TOURISTS to Europe now seem to have an occupation or an avocation that is a greater motivating factor in making the decision to travel to Europe. It used to be the "prestige" factor that sent many people to Europe. Now travelers go to see gardens, sports events, religious festivals, restaurants, theaters, farms, art museums, and you name it . . . people are interested in it.

Have been working like mad . . . writing and sending letters to hotels and restaurants in Europe . . . trying to get the price for my next summer's tour to Europe finalized.

Hope to keep it around \$1,200 (all inclusive), but I will not know definitely until I get all the answers back. I find it better to deal with hotels and restaurants that I've used before and enjoyed.

THERE ARE highlights that every country has to offer. In spite of a "special interest tour" being an attractive ticket to music lovers, artists, etc., I still think that pursuing such a narrow field of interest naturally takes away time and activity in broader fields. It's OK for the second time around, but in a first or only time tour of Europe, one shouldn't miss such places or activities as the bullfights in Madrid, the Vatican in Rome, going to the top of the Eiffel Tower in Paris, a gondola ride in Venice, the opera in Rome, the Hofbrauhaus in Munich, or Westminster Abbey in London.
