Stop Signs Okayed for Anza Avenue

City Councilmen approved a request for stop signs on Anza Avenue at 226th and 230th Streets Tuesday evening. The request had been recommended for denial by the Traffic Commission.

Acting on a petition signed by more than 100 residents of the area, the council approved the installation of signs for a one year trial basis.

Traffic commissioners had recommended that the speed limit on Anza, now 25 miles per hour south of Sepulveda Boulevard, be raised to 35. The commission said Anza Avenue is a major city street, and the

installation of stop signs would tend to increase accidents in the area from rear-end collisions. Studies of the area have shown; 90 per cent violation of the low speed limit. Citations have not been upheld in court because of the nature of the street.

Project Gets Council Okay

Storm drains in the Marble Estates tract, located north of Lomita Boulevard and east of Samuel Street will be installed in connection with developments now under construction in the area.

To complete the project, temporary systems will be installed from Lomita Boulevard and Early Avenue to existing drains at 234th Street and Hawthorne Avenue. City forces will do the work.

The project is being completed in order to provide protection for properties now being developed in the area. Funds for the project come from Drainage District 7-B assessments.
