New Unit in Sea Barrier Given Okay

Plans and specifications for another unit of the sea water barrier in Redondo Beach have been approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Known as Unit 1-D of the project, the job is expected to cost about \$375,000. It is designed to prevent contamination of fresh water by sea water.

Bids for the project will be opened Dec. 13. The contract is expected to be awarded about 10 days later.

The project includes the drilling of 19 recharge wells within the dedicated street right-of-way on Prospect Avenue, The 19 wells, to be drilled on Prospect between Anita Street and Spencer Street, will be 32 inches in diameter and 600 to 700 feet deep.

Unit 1 of the project is now under construction. It includes 12 wells between Spencer Street and Torrance Boulevard in Redondo Beach. The total barrier, involving 82 wells in an 11-mile stretch of coastline, will be finished by 1966.


