From Italy writes Mrs. M. J. K.: "I am an average American housewife, transplanted from the world of two automobiles, PTA meetings, and bridge club and dropped into a very different

"Last spring my husband decided to quit a very good job as a salesman and enroll as a medical student at the university here. In three weeks' time we sold our belongings, our furniture and our house, packed up our three children and the dog and descended upon Italy.

"This was quite a shock-both to the Italians and to us.

"But we are now packed into a nice little apartment here, our children are going to the Italian public school, and I no longer

have the pleasant diversions of my own car, or the neighborhood supermarket, or any automatic devices that left me time for the usual morning kaffeeklatsch, bridge games and all the rest of the time-consuming activities of American suburbia.

"And I find suddenly that my life has never been so full or so contented as now.

"I am learning to live as the Italian wives do, traveling on the city buses, shopping at the fruit and vegetable stalls and bartering with the merchants. I am learning to cook the Italian foods, including making my own pasta.

"Now I rarely open a can or a frozen dinner-with the sad result that my husband will have

to start on a diet, or else he will resemble the Fat Venus, male version. "I really enjoy seeing all this
