in California, calling for \$470 million in bonds. Of these, 73 per cent were approved, for \$366 million. Twenty-one of the defeated issues got more than 60 per cent, but less than 66% per cent of the votes cast. In 1961-62, the percentage of issues approved fell 57 per cent, for \$174 out of \$470 million. Thirty-seven defeated issues received between 60 per cent and the required two-thirds of the vote cast. ONE OF THE most difficult factors in the school cost situation to deal with has been construction of new classrooms to house the every-growing enrollments in elementary and high schools, and junior colleges. Soon after the end of the War it became apparent that many school districts could not finance needed new construction through bonds. The standard statutory limit of five per cent of assessed value on such bonds simply would not produce enough money for the building requirements of some districts.

During the past few sessions, much legislative attention has been paid to this matter of school construction costs and how best to pay for them. Some study has been given to the advisability of increasing the statutory limit on bonds for individual districts from five per cent to 10 per cent of assessed valuation, but no action was taken. Other ideas have also been reviewed.

TO AID "impoverished" districts, the Legislature passed, and the voters approved the first of a series of bond issues for construction loans to school districts which had nearly exhausted their own bonding capacity, and still needed funds for new classrooms. So far, a total of 91.335 billion of such bonds have been okehed, but it seems likely future proposals for the same purpose may be submitted to the voters.
