Metallurgist Author Of Article

A Torrance staff metallurgist is author of a major article in the current issue of Metal Progress, monthly journal of the American Society for Metals.

Leroy W. Davis notes details on "How To Deposit Metallic and Nonmetallic Coatings with the Plasma Arc Torch."

During the past five years a new tool—the plasma torch—has become available to engineers working with ceramics, cermets and refractory metals. The fact that gases passing through a high intensity electric arc are heated to very high temperatures and issue from

this arc as a stream of ions has been known for years.

THE DEVELOPMENT of means for producing and controlling this ionized stream of plasma continuously for long periods is a relatively recent accomplishment.

The high temperatures generated by the plasma flame—up to 30,000 degrees F.—permit the selection of an almost unlimited number of materials and combinations of materials for coatings and for built-up components.

Examples are alumina, magnesia, beryllia, zirconia, thoria, hafnia, tungsten and other re-

fractory alloys, as well as carbides and nitrides of the refractory metals.

DAVIS IS staff metallurgist, Harvey Engineering Laboratories, Harvey Aluminum in Torrance. He has been associated with the light metals industry for the past 40 years, including eight years with Harvey.

Davis studied chemical engineering at Case Institute of Technology, graduating in 1922, then later went on to continue his education at Case, receiving a degree in metallurgical engineering in 1931.
