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Assembly Gets Bills On Boxing

Outright abolition of professional boxing is the latest legislative proposal to hit newspaper headlines. In reaction to
the serious injury of a contestant in a Los Angeles bout,
which later caused his death,
two Assemblymen have introduced a couple of measures
which would put a quick end
to commercialized boxing if
passed.

The first is a constitutional The first is a constitutional amendment, which would appear on the November, 1964 ballot, and which would repeal the present authorization by the voters for professional bouts. The second is a resolution requiring action by both houses, which would instruct the state athletic commission to suspend all boxing licenses immediately. In effect, the later would put an abrupt stop to the sport, even before voters could pass on the proposed amendment.

A constitutional amendment

is necessary to invoke a per-manent ban on prizefights. In 1924 the voters approved an initiative measure which legalinitiative measure winci negatized professional boxing matches and set up the athletic commission to license participants and supervise the matches. In 1932, the Constitution was amended to permit the Legislature to amend the basic law as necessary, but not to abolish boxing, to do which requires another vote of the

people.

ANOTHER LINE of legislative approach to greater safety in prize-fighting will be used in proposed legislation which would revise existing rules governing boxing equipment, matches, and contestants. The Assemblyman author has declared that positive and dramatic steps must be taken toward greater safety if boxing is to be preserved as a major sport.

During our first 1962 special session, a house resolution was adopted to the Assembly calling for an investigation of boxing by an interim committee. This action was triggered by a ring death in New York which brought nation-wide publicity. The Assembly Committee on Governmental Efficiency and Economy held hearings on the matter, and received a number of suggestions for improvement in law and practices from a number of sources close to professional boxing. The Committee, which submitted its report to our current session recently, made a number of specific recommendations for legislative action.

BILLS EMBODYING these

BILLS EMBODYING these recommendations have been introduced, and will be up for committee action in the near future. Among the most important ideas included are first, that the athletic commission establish and maintain an sion establish and maintain an apprentice system in boxing; second, that all training gymnasiums be licensed and supervised; and third, that referees be ordered to stop any bout if a contestant has been knocked down three times.

down three times.
Wide publicity was aroused by the Governor's endorsement of the effort to abolish professional boxing by constitutional amendment. He declared that competition for championship status, and the interstate character of the business made it impossible to regulate it successfully.

Members of the athletic commission including a practicing

mission, including a practicing physician, rose to the defense of boxing, and indicated that recommendations of the in-terim legislative committee could help improve the situa-tion considerably.
