

PORK STUFFED PEPPERS

(From your original pork roast)

Saute I large onion, finely chopped, in 2 tablespoons salad oil, just enough to soften. Stir in 2 cups finely diced cold pork roast, 1/4 cup minute rice, I envelope spaghetti sauce mix, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1 1/2 cups water. Cover Skillet. Heat just to boiling, then remove from heat and let stand 15 minutes until rice is tender and all the liquid has been absorbed. In the meantime, halve the peppers lengthwise; cut out stem, seeds and membrane. Parboil in a small amount of salted water in a large saucepan for just 5 minutes. Drain well, Arrange the pepper halves, in a single layer in a long greased shallow pan or dish. Fill with the pork and rice mixture. Bake in a 350 oven for 15 minutes, then open the door and sprinkle with I cup (4 ounces) grated process American Cheese. Bake 10 more minutes until the cheese is bubbly. Serve at once. Makes 6 portions. (a pleasant variation to this recipe is to add 1/2 cup whole kernel corn to the rice mixture just before stuffing the pep-
