The bill would expand the existing law which prohibits discrimination on account of race, color, religion, national by public financing, to all kinds of housing, including all privately owned housing, except single-unit dwellings by owners as residences. The types of acts prohibited remain the same: it is unlawful to refuse to sell or rent housing to persons of a minority group; to discriminate against them in the terms or conditions, or county jail sentence.

Proponents of the bill maintain that its enactment is necessary to prevent discrimination; housing which forces many people to live under substandard, unhealthful, unsanitary, and crowded conditions.
