## State Housing Proposal Goes to Assembly Group

One of the most delicate and difficult areas in which legislators are called upon to work is that relating to the discrimination against minority groups. All of us realize only too well that any form of it is repugnant to the basic principles of our American society.

Yet to develop legislation which will prevent any kind of it, and still be fair to all, is not easy.

A number of bills have been introduced in our current session which propose extensions of existing anti-discrimination legislation in various ways. All are supported by the state administration, so their passage in some version is anticipated by many.

ONE OF THE most important of these measures, and one which has already aroused considerable controversy, relates to prevention of discrimination in housing. The bill has been heard by the Assembly Committee on Governmental Efficiency and Economy, and was sent to the floor with a recommendation for passage. It has been re-referred to the Ways and Means Committee for consideration of the cost factors involved.

The bill would expand the existing law which prohibits discrimination on account of race, color, religion, national origin, or ancestry in connection with any housing assisted by public financing, to all kinds of housing, including all privately owned housing, except single-unit dwellings by owners as residences. The types of acts prohibited remain the same: it is unlawful to refuse to sell or rent housing to persons of a minority group; to discriminate against them in the terms or conditions of sale or rental; or to make any inquiries as to their status as members of a minority group.

OTHER IMPORTANT changes made by the measure include the coverage of real estate brokers and salesmen among those specifically affected, and the inclusion of any persons or financial institutions to whom application is made for financial help on housing. The expanded law would be enforced by the Fair Employment Practices Commission, in contrast to court enforcement of present law on public housing. The procedure it could follow are spelled out in the bill, and contain provision for obtaining court action to prevent disposal or rental of housing under Commission investigation. Violations of the act would be misdemeanors punishable by fine or county jail sentence.

Proponents of the bill maintain that its enactment is necessary to prevent discrimination in housing which forces many people to live under substandard, unhealthy, unsanitary, and crowded conditions. Such conditions, they state, have caused increased rates of crime, disease, fire, and juvenile delinquency. Therefore such discrimination is contrary to the health and welfare of the people of California.

OPPONENTS OF the proposed law say that its enactment would not end discrimination in housing, but would drive the practice underground. They maintain that it would result in further whittling away of the principle of private property, and added restrictions on owners' freedom of use. They argue that it would have an adverse effect on the real estate market, and therefore on the whole economic fabric of the state. They declare that to give arbitrary powers of enforcement to an administrative agency could lead to harassment of citizens. Education, they assert, is the only effective solution to problems of discrimination in any field.

Defeat by voters in a referendum election of a closely similar city ordinance in Berkeley has increased speculative interest in the final outcome on this bill. Opponents gained heart, though proponents are still confident.

## Witnesses Plan May Convention

A three-day assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses will be held in May at the Hermosa Biltmore, it was reported here yesterday by Leonard Olliff, presiding minister of the Torrance congregation. Purpose of the assembly will be a further study of the Bible and the importance of applying Bible principles to everyday living, Mr. Olliff said.

Theodore Jaraca, district supervisor, will speak at a Sunday session on the theme, "Who Will Win the Struggle for World Supremacy?"

The convention, emphasizing the theme "Right Kind of Ministers," will be held May 16-19, Mr. Olliff said.
