County Opens Storm Drain Bond Bidding

The Board of Supervisors has opened bids for sale of \$15 million in 1958 storm drain bonds to finance drainage projects through the fall of this year.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the apparent high bidder on the issue was Security First National Bank and United California Bank. The firms submitted an offer to purchase the bonds at a net interest rate of 3.042 per cent. A total of five bids were filed.

The 1958 storm drain bond program calls for construction of 184 critically needed projects in various county areas at an overall cost of \$225 million.
