OVEN ROASTED LAMB SHANK DINNER Put this dish in the oven and forget about it, if you can! The aroma will be reminder enough that in a few hours your delicious lamb dinner will be ready for the table. Preheat the oven to 300 degrees. While it heats place in a heavy baking plan or a small roaster 4 lamb shanks and 2 cloves garlic, cut in thirds. Mix together and pour over the shanks, I teaspoon rosemary, 1/2 teaspoon oregano, 1/2 teaspoon dill seed, I large onion, sliced thin, I large can (No. 300) tomato sauce, ¼ cup brown sugar, ½ teaspoon salt and I cup dry white wine. Cover the roaster or pan tightly and cook slowly at 300 for three hours; uncover pan and cook 30 more minutes to brown the meat, basting once or twice. Pour the sauce from the pan and cook over medium-high heat for just 3 minutes until it reduces itself to half the original volume. Pour back the tender shanks and serve at once over hot buttered rice or noodles Makes 4 portions.
