

Thus long ago Rev. Samuel Worchester, preaching to the Cherokees, refused to take out cherokees, retused to take out a license, and to swear alle-giance to the State of Georgia. When Georgia jailed him for not taking the loyalty oath, the U. S. Supreme Court freed him: The court would allow no state to interfere in United

2. Until the Civil War, the Federal Government regarded Indians as wards and dependent nations—foreign nations, yet under U. S. control. In 1871, however, Congress de-

no longer dependent. Indians still ran their own affairs for the most part, as ilustrated in a case titled In Re Crow Dog.

In 1883 Crow Dog killed another Sioux for stealing a friend's wife. Crow Dog made amends under tribal law, and the tribe closed his case. Soon afterwards Federal officers sought to try him for murder, but the Supreme Court said no: Such cases did come un-der tribal law and this one had been settled.

Shortly afterward Congress gave Federal courts jurisdic-tion over most criminal cases our treaties governed.

IN 1834 Congress set up the Bureau of Indian Affairs to make and carry out rules made under these treaties.

U. S. Supreme Court invalidated the conviction of a California Indian for murder. He must face trial in a Federal must face trial in a Federal court instead.
