Dare You Become A Bottle Blonde?

"Thirty-five per cent of the men in this country are now secretly coloring their hair," claims Frances O'Neill, redheaded-for-the-moment director of education for the vast Clairrol coloring concern.

"Men are more vain than women," she said smugly.

What Frances doesn't know about changing the color of your hair no one else does except—except myself, of course.

"I've changed the colors of over one million heads," said Frances happily, but then her expression saddened.

"Do you know that less than 10 per cent of the beauticians really know how to do hair coloring properly?" she asked. I knew there were a lot of bad ones, but I hadn't realized how many.

These poorer-than-average hairdressers never have had a real interest in coloring but are now being pushed into it by Clairrol's multi-million-dollar advertising campaign, which has changed the thinking of many a woman.

Their full-color ads showing luscious blondes sighing, "If I have only one life to live let me live it as a blonde," have driven many a woman to hit the color bottle.

There are four bottle blondes for every bottled redhead, according to Frances. However, she feels that many women now wearing the blonde shades should actually be some other color.

"Only the skin tone can give you the clue to the proper colors," says Frances. An olive skin can wear dark auburn, whereas peaches-and-cream coloring may wear the Titian reds or champagne blondes.

Instead of consulting your beautician for proper color selection, you should visit a local cosmetic counter and ask the girl

who sells make-up what color she recommends, since she is more familiar with skin tone ranges. Then get a good beautician to apply it.

There are more bottle blondes in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Chicago, New York and Miami than any other cities across the country.

Some practical advice from Frances: Don't be misled by color charts. They are based on 100 per cent gray hair that is completely bleached out. Dark on dark goes even darker. If you are trying to cover up a few gray hairs in a brown tone, select a color at least two shades lighter than your own hair to get the most natural effect.

Should you want a change and are afraid of what your beast might say, Frances suggests you make it a mild color change, which will give you a lift—and he will never notice the difference.
