Reunion Slated

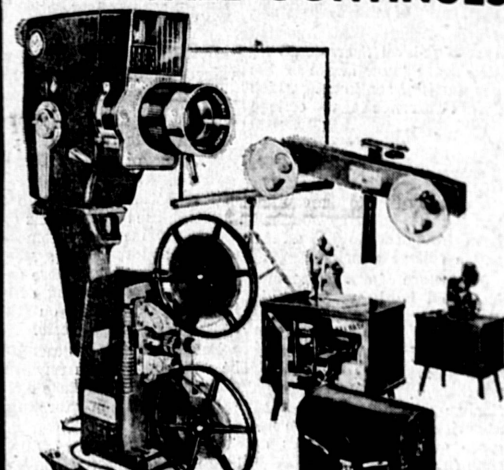
