1 c cornmeal	2 tsp. chili powder
1 large onion	1 egg (well beaten)
(finely chopped)	1/2 c milk
1 green pepper	21/2 c tomato juice
(finely chopped)	salt and pepper

Combine meat, cornmeal, onion, green pepper and seasonings; add combined egg and milk; mix thoroughly. Shape into a loaf and place in shallow baking dish. Pour tomato juice over loaf. Bake in moderately hot oven, about 375 degrees for 40 minutes. Serves 6 generously.

### FRIJOLES CON QUESO

1	lb. pink beans	11/2	c nippy cheese
1	med. onion		(grated)
	(chopped)	2	tbsp. salad oil
1	clove garlic		or bacon drippings
	(chopped)		Salt and pepper

Wash beans, soak overnight or for at least 5 or 6 hours. Simmer gently in the soaking water for 2 hours, or until tender, adding water to keep beans covered. Drain and reserve liquid.

Saute onion and garlic slowly in oil until tender. Mash about 1 cup of cooked beans and add to the onion-garlic mixture with about 1 cup of bean liquid. Blend well.

Add remaining beans and cheese; cook slowly, stirring constantly until cheese is melted. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

If desired, this can be prepared early and reheated on top of stove or in oven just before serving. Serves 8.

Beat eggs until light and thick. Slowly add sugar and beat with a spoon 5 minutes or electric beater 21/2 minutes. Fold sifted dry ingredients into egg and sugar mixture, all at once. The folding in should take only 1 minute. Bake in waxed paper lined 8 inch square pan at 360 degrees for 30 minutes.
