


## Woman Lives With Bullet **In Forehead**

A 34-year-old Torrance manishe was going back to her A 34-year-old Torrance man shot his female acquaintance in the head Tuesday night then turned the gun on himself. The attempted murder-sui-clde occurred about 9:30 in the home of the victim, Dorothy Metzler, 30, of 3127 W. 177th St. She was in critical condi-tion at Harbor General Hos-pital late Wedneeday. The

tion at Harbor General Hospital late Wednesday. The bullet, which entered her head between the eyes and went down toward the throat, had not been removed by midafter. Robert Arthur Ryan, 34, of 2818 W. 182nd St., died at Har-bor General Hospital about three hours after the shooting.

THE SHOOTING occurred after Mrs. Metzler told Ryan

"I FELL back on the couch. He then put the gun to his own head. I heard the gun and saw him fall. I didn't lose consciousness at all. I thought I was dying," she said.
