Blowouts A Danger In Summer

High speed and hot weather driving during the summer months increases the chances of at tire blowing out to cause a fatal accident, according to the California Highway Patrol. Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden points out that blowouts, though infrequent these days, tend to occur more often in the summer because of the daded strain placed on tires by extreme heat which builds up pressure.

"A driver's natural reaction is to apply the brakes in the case of a blowout, but forceful braking can send your car into a dangerous skid or possibly a rollover."

The safest procedure is to let the car slow down before you brake, keeping the steering wheel in a firm grip and the car on a straight, even course.

When the vehicle slows to the point where you have absolute control, apply the brakes smoothly with moderate pressure, Crittenden said.
