A surplus was built up during the first year the tax was collected.

County to File Brief In Pledge Law Suit

County Counsel Harold Kennedy has been instructed by the Board of Supervisors to act as a "friend of the court" in the lawsuit of a Washington High School teacher trying to remove the words "under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance. The supervisors instructed Kennedy to prepare the Amicus curiae brief on motion of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn. Hahn, in offering his motion, said the county counsel should study the case and its proceed-

ings in the public interest, and should file a counter action to retain the phrase. The county has the right to file briefs and take part in a case under Amicus curiae although it is not a party to the case. Hahn said he was opposed to any action to remove the words "under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance. He added, "Next, some people will be looking for a way to take 'In God We Trust' off American coins."

HE SAID THE duty of the city to protect its citizens had nothing to do with any disputes between CORE and Southwood's developer, Don Wilson.

WHILE CITY Council members were struggling with the problem here, Dr. Christopher Taylor, chairman of the United Civil Rights Committee, confirmed that the Southwood tract had been singled out for a mass demonstration Saturday.

"We want to show that we are back of CORE," Dr. Taylor said.

He said between 200 and 300 persons were expected to take part in the demonstration, meeting at Wrigley Field in Los Angeles and coming to Torrance in buses and cars.

Reading Program Reviewed

Dr. A. N. Posner, assistant superintendent of instruction, reviewed the remedial reading program in Torrance for Board of Education members Monday evening. Dr. Posner prepared the review at the request of member William Hanson and superintendent Dr. J. J. Huil.

Posner told the board that four consultants will conduct teacher training seminars during the fall. These seminars will deal with techniques for teaching remedial reading. In addition, several new ideas will be tried during summer sessions. These include team teaching, special reading clinics, extra teaching sessions, and a staggered primary day.

After hearing the report, the board formalized the program and adopted a motion instructing the superintendent to submit regular reports on the progress of the program. The program was designed to be used in all schools, and had no effect on the instructional budget for next year.

Library Pact Gets Approval

Approval of the new Torrance Library contract with the county library system was voted yesterday by the Board of Supervisors. In approving the contract, the board pointed out that Torrance is the only city now under contract with the county system.

The new contract covers all Torrance branch libraries. It provides that the city shall provide and maintain library facilities, and county services are paid for by the city. A purchasing provision is also included.

The contract also permits non-residents of the city to use the facilities, and the county pays these costs. Prior to action by the supervisors, the contract was approved by the City Library Commission and the City Council.
