Brown got nothing. How come? Financial recovery rests almost wholly at discretion of the trial court or jury. Without evidence of prejudice of some kind, no higher court is likely to change such an award. For who is better able to set an award than the judge or jury that heard every witness!

Many things guide a court in making a personal injury judgment. But however great the harm, it is rare that the injured party can recover unless the defendant was at fault, and the injured party was not the injured party was not.

SOME factors that may go

into a judgment:

1. Impairment of earnings:
The worth of one's actual lost time in earnings can be recov-ered as well as the value of one's earning power.

2. Impairment of future earnings: In case of a permanent disability, for example, the court looks at what one may reasonably have expected to earn the rest of his life in the court opens adjustion or view of one's education or training and his special talents and prospects.

3. Medical care and other such expenses as future sur-gery, if needed; future care; nursing; special medical equipment, etc.

4. A husband may recover damages for loss of "consortium," (his wife's companionship and services).

5. Physical pain and suffering; sometimes fright or shock when injured; humiliation resulting from disfigurement or disability.

SEAMLESS TUNA CANS . . . The Reynolds Metals Co. of Torrance has announced it is launching production of aluminum tuna cans and beer can lids. The tuna can will be produced at 300 per minute, directly from pre-coated coil, on the shallow drawing press above. The cans "nest" when stacked, and will weigh less than half as much as cans made of "thin" tinplate, thus reducing tuna freight costs an average of \$1.25 per 1,000 cans, Reynolds officials said.
