of their birth was made; this is true of many who are now reaching retirement age, Davis said, because less than 45 per cent of births in the United States between 1890 and 1920 were reported. But there are many other documents that can be used to establish proof of age, and most people have at least one. . .

**OTHERS NEVER** think about proofs until they file their claims and then find that they have to send proof for a rec-ord. A person who does not know his exact date of birth or who has used different dates in the past, is particularly likely to encounter difficulty with

to encounter difficulty with proof of age. Social security requirements regarding proof of age are not intended to create hardship for the claimant. Certificates of birth or baptism are usually the best types of evidence but other records such as old insur-ance policies, marriage licen-ses, family Bibles, census and military records. passports. and military records, passports, and immigration records may also be considered.

IN FACT, according to Davis, "Everything from a gold watch to a tombstone has been used as proof of age." The gold watch was engraved to show the owner's name, the date of presentation, and that it was given on his 12th birthday. The tombstone was examined by a social security field representasocial security field representa

social security field representa-tive because it showed the date of death of the applicant's mother who, according to other evidence, died at his birth. In some cases, proof of mar-riage, divorce, adoption, recent earnings, and the like may be required. These may take time to get if not already in the ap-plicant's possession. Thus, the person who does not follow the "inquire before you retire" ad-vice may have to wait for his retirement until the necessary evidence is located, and evalu-ated. ated
