Congress has established Jan. 31, 1965 as the cut-off date for the Korean GI Bill, according to Loren Heft, veterans service officer at the Inglewood and Torrance branches of the Los Angeles County Office.

eyond that time.

Veterans eligible for the Korean GI Bill benefits are those who served on active duty at any time between Jan. 27, 1950 and Jan 31 1955 Requirements stipulate that a veteran must have served at least 90 days and must begin his study program within three years of his date of discharge or separation.

Korean conflict veterant with service-connected disabilities are classified under a different program which provides a cut-off date nine years from the date of separation.
