The Board of Supervisors inse approved purchase of a parcel of land near Torrance needed as part of the Dominguez Channel flood control improve-ment Supervisor Burton W. ment, Supervisor Burton Chace has reported. The parcel, comprising 8,933 square feet, is located on Perry Street north of Carson Street, It will be purchased by the County Flood Control District from Mrs. Toshie Yoshioka for \$5,174.22, Chace said. The land will be used in constructing a will be used in constructing a section of the channel from Wilmington Avenue to Avalon Boulevard Boulevard. Work is in progress under a \$3,466,329 contract awarded by the Board of Supervisors to Guy F. Atkinson Co. of Long Beach last July. The unit is due for comple-tion late in 1965, Chace said.
