TOKYO-"Here Is Happiness" is a weekly offering of the Fuji Television Network, and, inasmuch as it is a wedding show, the Fuji people must be saluted for the optimistic tone of its title.

Many years ago U.S. television learned there was extensive commercial fulfillment to be found in the sight of two lovers being united in holy matrimony. The fad passed and the Hollywood show disappeared, but there is no sign of boredom on the part of the Japanese ladies in the television audience. Recently "Here Is Happiness" celebrated its 200th marriage cer-emony in three and one-half years with a mass of induction of 50 grooms and 50 brides.

The inducements are strong. The sponsor offers a complete package - wedding ceremony, reception, honeymoon, a washing machine and a year's supply of his soap if the couple will share their moment of bliss with several million strangers via television.

The Japanese, who seem so reserved and polite to foreigners, also seem to be capable of shedding their shyness in exchange for a washing machine full of soap. However, many people here are still violent on the subject of sanctity of the wedding ritual and deplore the show.

Musei Tokugawa, the program's 72-year-old emcee, defends the TV marriages by saying: "There is nothing wrong with a wedding being a show. The ceremony is intended to show everyone that 'This is my woman so please don't touch' or 'This is my man and don't lead him to temptation.'"

More likely the big attraction is the expense-free wedding, or "Do you take this washing machine to be your lawful wedded gift?"

While listening to the flawless dubbing of Japanese voices to the familiar U.S. television shows here, I recall Vivian Vance's story about the day the Tokyo students' tour visited the set of "I Love Lucy." The youngsters mobbed her-all talking in Japanese. So perfectly are the lip movements matched on the Nippon TV screen that they though she spoke fluent Japanese.

The television commercials here are supposed to be limited to 10 per cent of the total program and placed only at the beginning and the end of the show, but they seem to be ever-present due to the frequent use of "double exposure" blurbs superimposed over the show in progress. I thought at first they were sub-titles.

Japanese advertising in general seems less offensive to the foreigner because the letters are merely beautiful characters, attractive and mysterious in themselves. If one knows they mean "Smoke Lighter Tobacco" they immediately lose their attraction.

Warrior Scholarship Group Organizes Tutoring Service
