Adequate advance must ge given to all interested individuals and organizations and to the general public through all news media.

rREQUENTLY, research material must be collected from many sources, and summarized for information of committee members. Written state members with these desiring to make formal. many sources, and summarized for information of committee members. Written statements must be obtained from those desiring to make formal presentations. An itemized agenda must be prepared to hotify all concerned of topics which will be taken up. Sometimes, subpoenas must be issued to make certain that individuals attend, or records are produced.
