Cabrillo Savings Makes Move to New Home Office

One of the southwest's fast-growing financial institutions has occupied one of the most beautiful buildings in the area. Cabrillo Savings and Loan Assn., founded three years ago, moved last week into its new headquarters building — a multistory building located at Crenshaw Boulevard and Pacific Coast Highway. Pietro DiCarlo, president and chairman of the board of the association, said the decision to remain in the same general area was prompted by the large numbers of customers in the vicinity of Rolling Hills Plaza. THE HIGHLIGHT of the new home office is a spectacular colonnade of tall concrete arches across the north and east elevations of the building. Made of pre-stressed concrete, the arches tower 30 feet into the sky. Designed by architect Austin Daly, the building combines the modern schools with the light, airy look of old Spain with a surprising effectiveness. Imported Italian marble mosaics are used throughout the building, and the landscaping has been designed to carry out the structural theme. Tagged with a name, the architectural style might be called "Mediterranean modern."

Banks to Aid DMV Renewal

Tom Bright, Director of Motor Vehicles, has announced the cooperation of more than 150 banks in California for the annual motor vehicle registration renewal period this year. Bright said DMV employees would be stationed in banks in almost all areas of the state to provide quick renewal for motorists. Southwestern banks which will have DMV facilities available include the Bank of America branches at 1030 W. Gardena, Gardena; Redondo Beach Boulevard and Hawthorne Avenue, Lawndale; 200 N. Pacific Avenue, Redondo Beach; and 108 W. Anaheim, Wilmington. RENEWAL services will be available during normal banking hours at the banks from Jan. 2 until Feb. 4, the deadline for completing registration without penalties. Many types of registration applications will be handled only at permanent field offices of DMV or at auto club offices where members are offered registration services. These include, explained Bright, registration for motorists who do not receive 1964 statements. Persons who need to apply for transfer of ownership and registration records or more complex services must visit a regular department or auto club office.
