## Champagne Punch

2 bottles Champagne 2 bottles Sauterne Wine 1 bottle Ginger Ale 4-oz. Brandy or Rum

1 bottle Soda 4-oz. Triple Sec

2 tbsp. cold water

14 tsp. cinnamon 1 slightly beaten egg white ¼ tsp. cloves

1/2 cup sugar

14 tsp. alspice 2 cups walnuts (halves)




