 This is a good time to prune deciduous trees. Remove the crossing limbs and twiggy growth. Cut long willowy limbs back somewhat pruning to an outside growth bud (long and narrow bud). Make sure you do it right—check with your California Association of Nurserymen nurseryman before you start.

2. Camellias are blooming wildly. Look them over now and make your selection. Excellent planting time, too.

3. Houseplants can be repotted if pot-bound. Look at the lower leaves. If they're yellow they probably need feeding or repotting—if they've been fed recently, it's repotting, of course.

4. Any time now your roses should be taking a well earned rest. When the foliage really starts dropping you can start pruning. Remove all foliage and burn it or dispose of it in the trash can.

5. A good time to plant the evergreens as well as the deciduous trees and shrubs. Be careful not to break the ball of dirt around the roots when planting.
