Politician To Appear

Senator Birch Bayh of Indiana will address El Camino College Young Democrats in the Campus Theater at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Bill Yaney, president of the college organization announced.

Yaney invited the public to attend the lecture without charge.

The Indiana Democrat, selected one of the 10 outstanding young men of 1963 by the U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, has been mentioned as a possible vice presidential candidate. He was elected to the United States Senate at the age of 34, after serving for eight years in the Indiana House of Representatives.

Senator Bayh served as Speaker of the House in 1959 and Minority Leader in 1957-58 and 1961-62. He was voted the "outstanding Representative of the General Assembly" in 1961 by newspaper men and women who had covered the sessions.

Senator Bayh graduated from Purdue University, School of Agriculture in 1952. He studied government and social studies at Indiana State College and received a doctor of jurisprudence degree from Indiana University School of Law in 1960.

The youthful senator was

president of his graduating class at Purdue University and was the first student from Purdue to win the Alpha Tau Omega National Award as the "most outstanding Omega undergraduate."

Senator Bayh is a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee and the Senate Public Works Committee. At the request of the vice president, Senator Bayh was appointed to the Board of Visitors, of the Merchant Marine Academy.

He is a member of the Executive Board of the Washington Alumni Assn. of Indiana University.

Principals Urge Override Support

The Torrance Elementary School Principals Assn. has endorsed the Feb. 4 override election. The voting at the January meeting on the resolution of support was unanimous, according to Richard Welte, president.

The principals cited higher costs, increased enrollments, and decreasing state aid in urging voters to approve the 40-cent hike in school taxes.

Earth Science Classes Planned at El Camino

Increased emphasis upon the earth science area of instruction will result in the presentation of expanded courses during the spring semester at El Camino College, Carl Meadows, assistant director of instruction, announced this week.

Courses in astronomy, world geography and physical and historical geology are planned for students preparing future professions in government and private industry.

"Career opportunities for students of geology, geography and astronomy are increasing daily with the emergence of new nations seeking technical help and with the arrival of the space age," Meadows said. "Geography 11, world and regional geography, will be conducted by Ivar Ween, earth science instructor, who has returned from seven months of travel through Europe, Africa, Asia Minor, the Far East, Australia and Polynesia. His tour included the areas along the "iron" and "bamboo curtains" Ween's presentation will include his personal films and film slides of the areas he traveled in, as well as films made recently during trips to Sweden, Denmark, Germany and Scotland.

"The COURSE will be offered at 10 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday without prerequisite. "The value of this course is not only in making the student truly acquainted with the world and its people, but also in the discussions of problems of underdeveloped nations and their cultural and political difference to the U.S.," Ween said.

Geology 11 is offered in three daytime sections and one evening section and is designed to emphasize local problems. Information on flood control, faulting, subsidence and landslide problems is studied. An understanding of larger geological structures such as Death Valley and the Grand Canyon is initiated.

Appointments to register for the spring semester must be made at El Camino College before Jan. 27. Part-time or full-time students may secure reservations in the registration office. Final registration dates are Jan. 27-31.

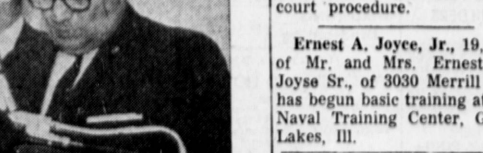
Carson High Seniors Get Day in Court

Youngsters Made Target Of Campaign

American Cancer Society's Centinela Valley-South Bay Office, which has heretofore directed its educational efforts on the health hazards of cigarette smoking primarily towards teenagers, is now widening its approach to include a younger age group, according to Richard J. Lescoe, M.D., district education chairman for the Society.

"Studies have shown that by ages 13-14 many youngsters have already started to smoke," Dr. Lescoe said. "One Southern California survey turned up two fifth graders who were pack-a-day smokers."

"THESE ARE the exceptions of course. Many children don't pick up the smoking habit until they are well into their teens. But when children are around 12 years old, they are forming some pretty strong ideas about the world around them and their role in it. We feel it is important to reach them at this impressionable age," Dr. Lescoe continued.

Currently being circulated in Los Angeles County elementary schools is a new 15-minute color-sound filmstrip titled "I'll Choose the High Road." The film takes the position that a high road of opportunity and challenge is open to all youngsters who want to realize their full potential by being physically, mentally, and socially fit.

THE FILM demonstrates the relationship between smoking, cancer and several other diseases.
