El Camino Alumna To Present Recital

A vocal recital of art-songs, opera arias and Negro spirituals will be presented by mezzo-soprano Stella Herman at El Camino College Feb. 7 at 8:30 p.m. in the campus theater.

The artistry of the El Camino College alumna has been described by the Music Journal as "... ideal . . . with her beautiful, sensuous mezzo-soprano voice and her deep, concentrated expression."
