WEST GERMAN TV won two of the seven prizes: Therese Giehse was voted Best Actress for her performance in a two-hour production of Gorki's "Vassa Zelzneva," and Rainer Erler was honored for Best Direction for a 90-minute com-edy, "Decorations for the Wun-derkind."

No Best Actor Award was made (!) but Trevor Howard was given a Special Mention for his title role in the Hall-mark drama "The Invincible Mr. Disraell." Other Special Mentions were given to Roma-nia's "Dialogue in Old Age," Japan's "Dark Gray Town," Belgium's study of impression-ist art, "Cri et Connaisance," France's "Angola '63" and Japan's "Ma Zone."


