## Mme. Nehru Will Lecture At El Camino

Madame Rajan Nehru, wife of Ratan K. Nehru, the secre-tary general of the ministry of external affairs, and cousin of India's Prime Minister Nehru, will speak tonight at 8:30 p.m. in the Campus Theater at El Camino on "The Chang-ing Face of India." Madame Nehru long active

Madame Nehru, long active in the welfare, educational and cultural activities of her homeland, is a founder-men-ber of the Indian Conference of Child Welfare and presently serves as president of the Delhi Youth Welfare.

Official posts currently held by Madame Nehru include president of the National Indian Federation of the Uniby ted Nations and president of the Delhi Red Cross; chairman-ship of the Indian National Theatre and vice-chairman of Theatre and vice-chairman of Bharatiya Kala Kendra. She is a member of the standing committee of the All India Woman's Conference and ser-ved as editor of "Roshni," the organization's office journal. Madame Nahwarana to Ame Madame Nehru came to Amer-ica in 1948 when her husband

ica in 1948 when her husband was appointed minister and charge d'affaires in Washing-ton, D.C. At that time she traveled widely in the United States, lecturing at universities and taking part in seminars and discussions on radio and television, She was awarded a prize by the Press Club of New York for speaking on "India, the New Democracy."
