If you're going to continue to pay taxes, be practical. Demand realism in the school.

When your daughter comes home from school, check her textbooks, if she brings any home, and her homework, if she does any.

Note how useless most of it is to equip her for facing the rigors of life. And you know how rigorous life can be.

Let's divide the school days; girls in the morning, boys in the afternoons. Insist on more classes and a heavier schedule. The heavier the load the more likely she'll get used to handling the load of housework that many of you whine is so heavy.

Break the classes down into laundering, cooking, husband-tending, baking and shopping. Include classes in canning and the making of pickles, preserves and jellies.

What ever happened to those marks of the good housewife?

Other classes should be how to plan a party, how to mix cocktails (and don't raise your voices to me about alcohol in the schools—better there under supervision than in the back seats of hot rods).

Select your teachers more carefully. The fact they have a teaching certificate doesn't necessarily mean they are good teachers any more than a marriage certificate makes a female a good wife.
